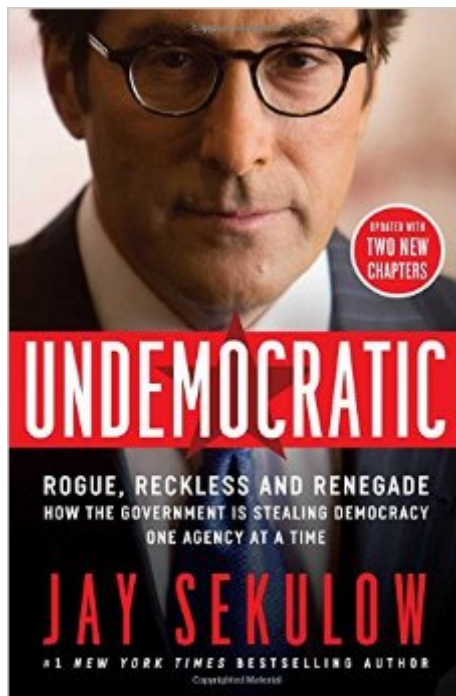

Thoughtful, thorough, and definitely alarming, it adds valuable input to these questions: How did we get in this mess and more importantly, where do we go from here?

You may ask. It is the US government bureaucracy born from extreme partisan that those who pay attention see rearing its ugly head each and every day.
